About your Gift Aid declaration

- If your declaration covers donations you may make in the future:
 - Please notify us if you change your name or address while the declaration is still in force.
 - You can cancel the declaration by notifying us – it will then not apply to donations you make on or after the date of cancellation or such later date that you specify.
- You must pay an amount of income tax and/or capital gains tax at least equal to the tax we reclaim on your donations in the tax year (currently about 28p for each £1 you give).
- If in the future your circumstances change and you no longer pay tax on your income and capital gains equal to the tax we reclaim, you should cancel your declaration (see note 1).
- If you pay tax at the higher rate you can claim further tax relief in your self-assessment tax return.
